The chance that a person will meet with some disabling injury within a year is about eleven times greater than the chance of death from any and all causes during the same period.

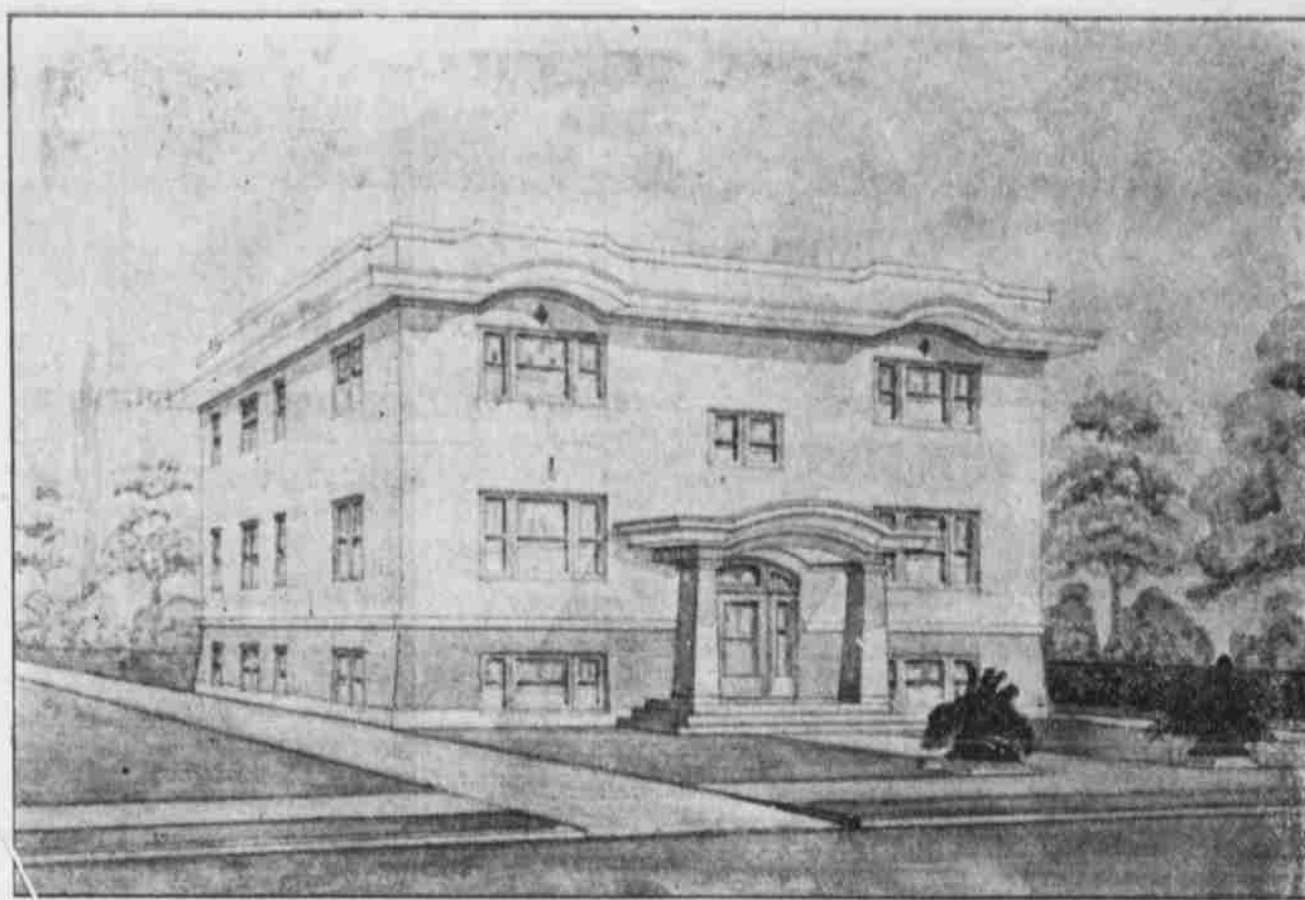
