COUNTY AGENT ADVISES FARMERS TO GATHER SEED CORN BEFORE FROST

In a notice just issued from the office of George H. Kellogg, County Agent for Lincoln County he says: If farmers will go through their fields with a sack tied over the shoulder, and gather seed corn before frost, and hang it where it can dry, unmoistened by rats or mice, they will avoid a lot of trouble and expense hunting seed corn in the spring. The selection of seed corn is just as important in profitable production as the selection of the sire for a herd. The ears should grow at a proper height on the stalk and the stalk should always be standing. The ears should be uniform, deep-kerneled, straight rowed and as many rows as possible. The kernel should carry out well to both ends. Now is the time before frost.
