It is true that he sometimes uses these holes as a refuge in deep winter. The eggs are glossy white and are placed in a hole in a decayed tree. The antics of the flickers at the mating time are really funny and many have written about them. Some of these red-shafted flickers stay here all winter but most of them migrate to the south.




