ORDINANCE NO. 134

An ordinance providing for the issuance of \$100,000 Water Works Improvement Bonds of the city of North Platte, Lincoln County, Nebraska, and the levy of a tax to pay principal and interest on same.

Whereas, a petition signed by more than fifty legal voters of the city of North Platte, Lincoln County, Nebraska, was presented to the Council of said City at a regular adjourned meeting thereof duly convened and held on the 6th day of May, 1921, which said petition did request the Mayor and Council of said City to submit to the legal voters at a special election to be called for that purpose, the question of said City issuing Water Works Improvement Bonds in the amount of \$100,000 for the purpose of constructing, repairing and increasing of the Central Water Plant of said City, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of six per cent (6%) per annum; and

Whereas, the Council did examine said petition and canvass the signatures thereon and found said petition was properly signed by more than 50 resident freeholders; and

Whereas, the Mayor and Council of the City of North Platte, in Lincoln County, Nebraska, did, by ordinance duly adopted May 6, 1921, call a special election pursuant to said petition to be held in said city on June 21, 1921, to vote upon the question of issuing \$100,000 Water Works Improvement bonds of said City, the proceeds to be used for the purpose of establishing, constructing, extending, enlarging, maintaining and operating the Water Works of said city and extending, relaying and enlarging water mains in said city; and

Whereas, notice of such election as duly given thirty days prior to such election, as required by law, and said election was in all respects duly called and held on June 21, 1921, and 268 of the electors voting at said election voted in favor of authorizing the issuance of said bonds and 74 of the electors voted against the authorization thereof; and

Whereas, the returns of said election were duly canvassed by the Mayor and Council of said City, and said Mayor and Council did find and declare that they were authorized to issue \$100,000 Water Works Improvement Bonds of said City;

Now therefore, Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the city of North Platte, Lincoln County, Nebraska, as follows:

Section 1. That there be and is hereby ordered issued \$100,000 Water Works Improvement Bonds of the city of North Platte, Lincoln County, Nebraska, dated July 1, 1921, numbered from 51 to 150 inclusive, of the denomination of \$1,000 each, bearing interest at the rate of six per cent (6%) per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of January and July of each year, said interest to be evidenced by coupons attached to said bonds; that said bonds mature July 1, 1941, and be redeemable at the option of said city at any time after five years from date, be signed by the Mayor of said City and attested with the signature of the Clerk of said City and the corporate seal thereof, and said coupons be executed by the facsimile signatures of said Mayor and Clerk, which said officials shall by the execution of said bonds adopt as and for their own proper signatures their respective facsimile signatures appearing on said coupons; and both principal and interest is payable at the office of the County Treasurer of said Lincoln County, at North Platte, Nebraska.

Section 2. That said bonds have been thereon forms of certificates of registration by the Auditor of the State of Nebraska, and by the County Clerk of Lincoln County, Nebraska.

Section 3. That bonds, coupons and certificates of registration be in substantially the following forms: (Form of Bond.) UNITED STATES OF AMERICA STATE OF NEBRASKA COUNTY OF LINCOLN CITY OF NORTH PLATTE WATER WORKS IMPROVEMENT BOND

No. \$1,000.00 KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That the city of North Platte in the County of Lincoln, in the State of Nebraska, hereby acknowledges itself to owe and for value received promises to pay to bearer, the sum of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) on the first day of July, 1941, with interest thereon from date hereof until paid at the rate of

six per cent (6%) per annum, payable semi-annually, on the first days of January and July of each year on presentation and surrender of the proper interest coupons hereto attached as they respectively become due; both principal and interest hereon are hereby made payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the office of the County Treasurer of Lincoln County, at North Platte, Nebraska.

This bond is one of a series of one hundred bonds, aggregating \$100,000, and said bonds are payable at the option of said city at any time after the expiration of five years from date hereof and for the prompt payment of this bond, both principal and interest at maturity, and the levy of taxes sufficient for that purpose, the full faith, credit and resources of said city are hereby irrevocably pledged.

This bond is issued by said City for the purpose of establishing, constructing, extending, enlarging, maintaining and operating the water works of said City and extending, relaying and enlarging water mains in said City in accordance with plans, specifications and estimates on file with the City Clerk in said City in full compliance with the provisions of Chapter 49, of the Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 1913, as amended and other laws of the State of Nebraska applicable thereto and is authorized by more than the required majority of the electors of said City voting at an election duly called and held for that purpose in said City, and by proceedings duly and properly had and taken by the Mayor and Council of said City.

And it is hereby declared, recited and certified that all acts, conditions and things required to be done and to exist precedent to and in the issuance of this bond have been properly and legally done and performed and do exist in due form and manner as required by law, and that the indebtedness of said City including this issue of bonds, does not exceed any limitation imposed by law.

In Testimony Whereof, the said City by its Mayor and Council has caused this bond to be issued by its Mayor and City Clerk and the corporate seal of said city to be affixed hereto, and the coupons hereto attached to be executed by the facsimile signatures of said Mayor and Clerk, which said officials do by the execution hereof adopt as and for their own proper signatures their respective facsimile signatures all as of the first day of July, A. D. 1921.

Section 4. That said bonds be executed as soon after the passage hereof as may be and be thereupon submitted to the State Auditor, together with duly certified transcript of all proceedings previous to the issuance of the said bonds, that, upon registration of said bonds by the State Auditor, the same be submitted to the County Clerk of Lincoln County, Nebraska, for registration, all as provided by the Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 1913, as amended.

Section 5. That upon execution and registration of said bonds, as herein provided, the same be delivered to Harris Trust and Savings purchaser of said bonds upon receipt by the Treasurer of said City of the purchase price thereof being not less than par value, pursuant to contract heretofore entered into which said sale is hereby confirmed and approved.

Section 6. Said City shall, and is hereby obligated to levy in due time and form, as required by law, in each of the years while any of said bonds remain unpaid, a tax sufficient to pay principal and interest thereon.

Section 7. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions hereof be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 8. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, approval and publication as required by law.
