The Special Commissioner appointed to locate a public road as follows:

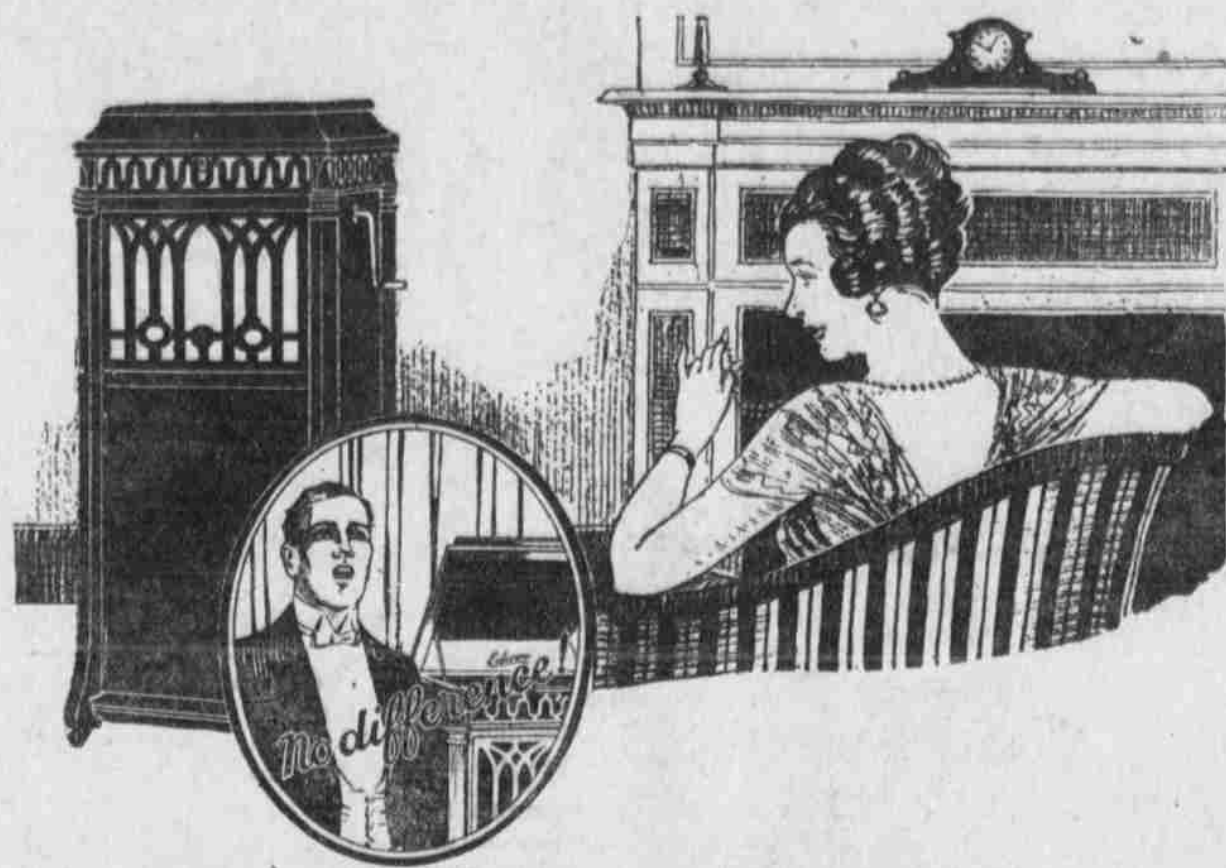
