"Three level parties were started out on October 22, 24 and 31 respectively, accomplishing sixty miles of level line at the end of the month. The second party started from Lexington carrying levels north to the main canal and thence west establishing bench marks for canal and reservoir surveys. The third party started at Brady, running east, establishing bench marks along the highway to be used for control for and drainage investigations. This party will take up the work of borings, to locate water table and noting soil conditions, on the first of the month.
