### CHARLES H. CROSBY

Charles H. Crosby was born at Oronogo, Mo. July 27, 1871 and died at North Platte, Nebr., Nov. 4, 1921 at the age of 50 years 3 months and 8 days. He attended the common schools and later took a course at the Kansas Normal College. He enlisted in the United States army at the age of 21 and served fifteen years in the service. He participated in the siege and battle of Santiago in the Spanish-American War did garrison duty from Febr. 1899 to Febr. 1901 in Cuba and was Post Quartermaster Sergeant in the Philippines from April 1901 to Oct. 1902. Returning to this country he was assigned to duty as Q-M at Fort Robinson and at Rock Island Arsenal. He left the army Nov. 20, 1907 and came to North Platte where he began working for the Union Pacific where he filled positions as bridge carpenter, house carpenter and air inspector. In Sept. 1918 he received the appointment of First Lieutenant in the Quartermaster Corps and served until he was discharged in June 1919 after the war was over. He returned to his position with the Union Pacific and it was while on duty as air inspector that he was killed.

On Sept. 6, 1901 he was married to Miss May I. McEvoy, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. P. H. McEvoy of this city and to this union six children were born, four of whom are now living. They are Laura, Charles, Paul and Mary. He also left a step-mother, one brother and two sisters all living at Webb City, Mo. The funeral was in St. Patrick's church and burial in North Platte Cemetery.
