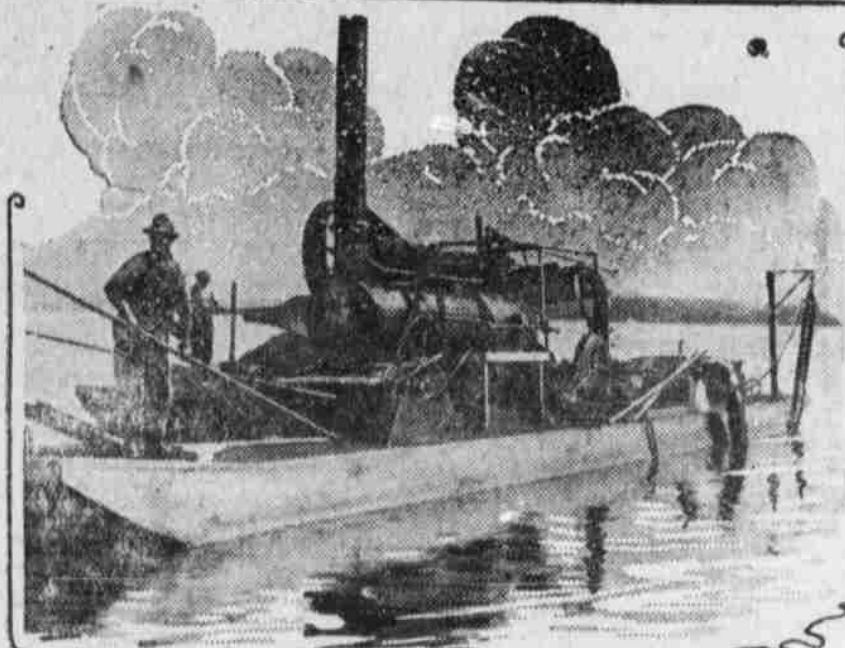

MINING COAL FROM RIVERBEDS



For a century the hard coal miners of eastern Pennsylvania have dumped "reject" or waste coal into the rivers. This coal was of supposedly poor quality, but geology scientists have discovered that after the waste coal has been washed down a river by the current, the grinding it received has made it better, in heat units, than the coal from the mines! Accordingly, the Susquehanna, Shamokin and other rivers are now dotted with scows on which are the best coal pumping machinery. The Shamokin gives up 750,000 tons a year. Popular Science says that a geologist, poking around, has just found a bed of coal in the Shamokin of two million tons.
