

**PRESENT CONDITION OF AMERICAN TRUST COMPANIES**

A handsome increase is shown in the volume of Trust company resources for Nebraska according to "Trust Companies of the United States," for 1921. Just published by the United States Mortgage and Trust company of New York. Nebraska's Trust companies have assets aggregating \$10,741,455 a gain of \$1,880,195, or about 21 per cent over last year. This volume, now in its ninth edition shows aggregate resources of the Trust companies at the close of business June 30, 1921, of \$12,223,430,513.35 as against \$12,451,877,583.58 last year and \$7,654,791,780.04 five years ago. The number of companies reporting was 2,390, as compared with 2241 last year.

In commenting on Trust company conditions during the past year, John W. Platten, president of the United States Mortgage and Trust company says:

"No stronger evidence of the stability of Trust companies has been forthcoming during their entire history than was demonstrated during the past year in connection with their banking operations. The year ending June 30, 1921, covered by the latest returns as given in the 1921 edition of "Trust Companies of the United States," was one of tremendous recession of prices and values attended by reduction of bank loans, contraction of credit and rapid falling off of deposits.

"Notwithstanding these adverse conditions, the resources of the Trust companies of the United States, as of June 30, 1921, amounted to \$12,223,430,000, for the 2,390 companies reporting, decrease for the year of only \$128,000,000.

"This situation, coupled with the fact that a substantial increase is shown in all branches of fiduciary business, is extremely gratifying, and affords further and convincing proof of the recognition by both corporations and individuals of the value of Trust company service."
