**ORDINANCE NO. 135**

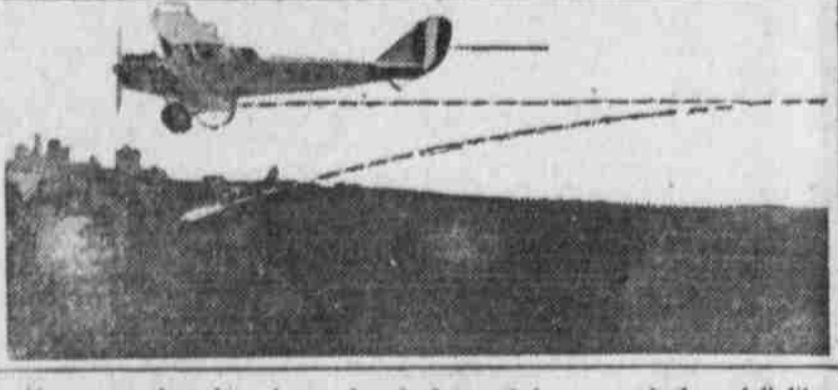
An Ordinance providing for the Paving of certain streets within the City of North Platte, Nebraska, and for the creation of Paving District No. 8.  
Be It Ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the City of North Platte, Nebraska:

**Section 1.**  
That the following streets, including the intersections thereof, and spaces opposite alleys, within the limits of the City of North Platte, Nebraska, be paved, to-wit:  
All that portion of Vine Street of said City, commencing on the south line of the intersection of Vine and West Sixth Street thence north along said Vine Street to the north line of the intersection of Vine and West Front Street in said City and all that portion of West Front Street, in said City commencing at the West line of the intersection of West Front and Vine Street of said City, thence West to the east line of the intersection of West Front and Ash Street in said City, and all that portion of Sycamore Street, commencing at the south line of the intersection of West Front and Sycamore Streets, in said City, running thence south to the north line of the intersection of South Sycamore and E Street in said City there to terminate, with exception of intersection at Fourth and Sycamore and Fifth and Sycamore Streets of said City.

**Section 2.**  
That all the streets and intersections thereof and spaces opposite Alleys as described in Section 1 of this Ordinance shall be, and constitute Paving District No. 8 of the City of North Platte, Nebraska, and said Paving District No. 8 of said City is hereby created.

**Section 3.**  
This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage approval and publication, ac-

**ORDINANCE NO. 136**

An Ordinance providing for and authorizing the issuance of District Paving Bonds of the City of North Platte, Nebraska, said Bonds to be known as District Paving Bonds of District No. 7, and to be used for the purpose of paying the costs of Paving the Alleys, exclusive of Intersections or Streets and Spaces opposite Alleys in Paving District No. 7 in said City, and empowering and directing the Mayor and City Clerk to sign and execute such Bonds on behalf of the City and providing for a special tax and Sinking Fund for the payment of said Bonds and the interest thereon.  
Be It Ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the City of North Platte, Nebraska:

**Section 1.**  
That for the purpose of paying the costs of Paving the Alleys, exclusive of the Intersection of Streets and Spaces opposite Alleys in Paving District No. 7, in the City of North Platte, Nebraska, the Mayor and Council of said City be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered and directed to execute and issue the Bonds of said City of North Platte, Nebraska, in the sum of Twenty-two Hundred and fourteen and forty one-hundredths Dollars (\$2,214.40) as hereinafter set forth.  
**Section 2.**  
Said Bonds shall be designated and known as District Paving Bonds of District No. 7, and shall be issued in denomination of \$500.00 each, and to be numbered 1 to 5 inclusive, and shall bear interest at the rate of 7 per cent per annum payable annually and said bonds shall each have interest coupons attached. Said bonds shall be dated on the 1st day of September, 1921, and shall become due and payable ten years from date, but shall be redeemable at the option of the City at any time after issuance. Said bonds, principal and interest, shall be payable at the office of the County Treasurer of Lincoln County, Nebraska, situated in the City of North Platte, Nebraska and for the payment thereof, both principal and interest, the credit of the City of North Platte, its property and its revenue are hereby pledged.

**Section 3.**  
That there shall be assessed and levied against the property of said District which said property shall constitute all of the property abutting on the alleys in said District, a special tax as provided by Statute, which shall be collected as other taxes of said City and when collected shall constitute a special fund for the pay-

That in the execution of said Bonds, the Mayor of said City is hereby empowered to sign said Bonds and interest coupons attached in his official capacity as Mayor, and the City Clerk shall attest the same under the Seal of said City and the coupons attested to said Bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and attested by the Clerk, without seal and when so signed and attested the same shall be and constitute the valid obligation of said City of North Platte.

**ORDINANCE NO. 137**  
An Ordinance providing for and authorizing the issuance of District Paving Bonds of the City of North Platte, Nebraska, said Bonds to be known as District Paving Bonds of District No. 2, and to be used for the purpose of paying the costs of Paving the Alleys, exclusive of Intersections of Streets and Spaces opposite Alleys in Paving District No. 2 in said City and empowering and directing the Mayor and City Clerk to sign and execute such Bonds on behalf of the City and providing for a special tax and Sinking Fund for the payment of said Bonds and the interest thereon.  
Be It Ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the City of North Platte, Nebraska:

**Section 1.**  
That for the purpose of paying the costs of paving the alleys, exclusive of the intersection of streets and spaces opposite alleys in Paving District No. 2 in the City of North Platte, Nebraska, the Mayor and Council of said City, be and they are hereby authorized, empowered and directed, execute and issue the bonds of said City of North Platte, Nebraska, in the sum of Sixteen Hundred Thirty and Eighty One-hundredths (\$1,630.80) as hereinafter set forth.  
**Section 2.**  
Said Bonds shall be designated and known as District Paving Bonds of District No. 2, and shall be issued in denomination of \$500.00 each, and be numbered 1 to 4 inclusive, and shall bear interest at the rate of 7 per cent per annum payable annually and said bonds shall each have interest coupons attached. Said bonds shall be dated on the 1st day of September, 1921, and shall become due and payable ten years from date, but shall be redeemable at the option of the City at any time after issuance. Said bonds principal and interest, shall be payable at the office of the County Treasurer of Lincoln County, Nebraska, situated in the City of North Platte, Nebraska, and for the payment thereof, both principal and interest, the credit of the City of North Platte, its property and its revenue are hereby pledged.

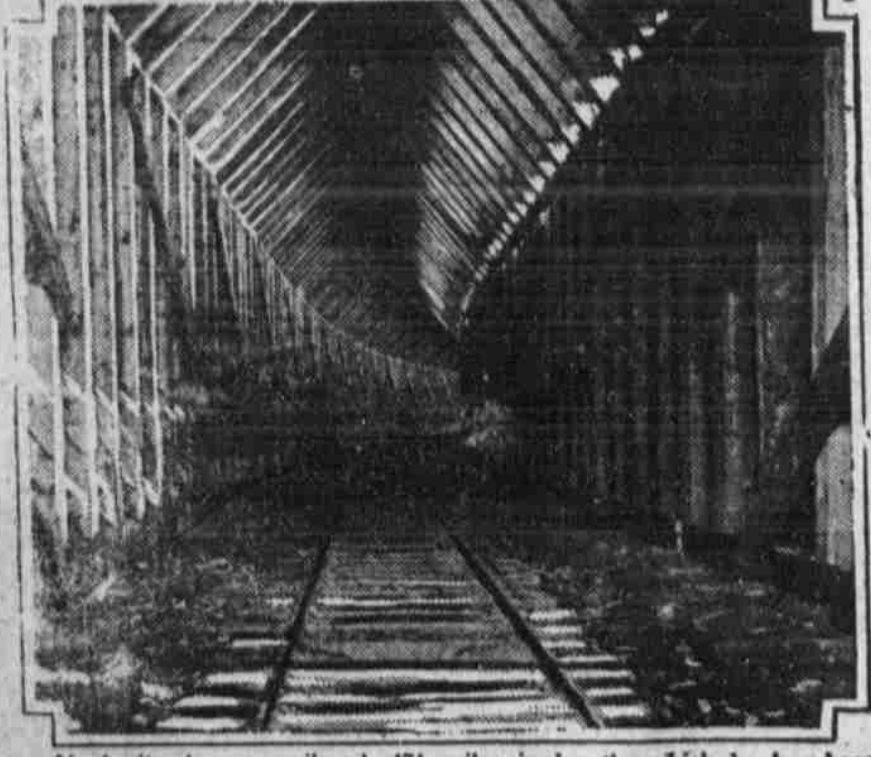
