Many of us insisted that the State Railway Commission should restore the old rates without the 10 per cent sur charge and without even having a hearing. The Commission took these requests under advisement and said they would make an announcement after the noon hour. At that time the Chairman said that it would be neceesary to have a hearing to find whether or not the Telephone Company could get along with out the sur charge. Then the experts of the Telephone Company were put on the stand and offered accountsheets, etc. by which they showed a profit of about 4 per cent. These witnesses were cross examined and it was shown that these accounts were padded and that there were duplications etc. The hearing lasted two days. The Telephone Company seemed to have no difficulty in persuading the commission that they should have any-
