NOTICE OF THE FORMATION OF PAVING DISTRICT NUMBER 8 IN THE CITY OF NORTH PLATTE NEBRASKA

To the owners of the record title of all property adjacent to or abutting upon the streets hereinafter described and all persons interested therein:

You and each of you are hereby notified that the Mayor and City Council of the city of North Platte did under date of December 29, 1921 pass and approve a certain ordinance forming and creating paving district No. 8 of the city of North Platte, Lincoln County, Nebraska. And that the following streets including the intersections thereof within the limits of the city are comprised within said

paving district to-wit: All that portion of Vine Street of said city commencing on the south line of the intersection of Vine and West 6th Street, thence north along said Vine Street to the north line of the intersection of Vine and West Front Streets in said city, commencing at the south line of the intersection of West Front and Vine streets of said city thence west to the east line of the intersection of West Front and Ash Streets in said city; and all that portion of Sycamore street commencing at the south line of the intersection of West Front and Sycamore Streets in said city, running thence south to the north line of the intersection of South Sycamore and E streets in said city; there to terminate, with the exception of the intersections at Fourth and Sycamore and Fifth and Sycamore Streets of said city.

Unless objections are filed as required by statute within twenty days from the first publication of this notice, the Mayor and City Council shall proceed to construct such paving.
