ORDINANCE NO. 138

An Ordinance providing, prescribing and defining the City Limits of the City of North Platte, Lincoln County, Nebraska, and repealing Ordinance No. 111 as passed by the City Council of the City of North Platte, Lincoln County, Nebraska, on the 20th day of January 1920.

Be it Ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the City of North Platte, Lincoln County, States of Nebraska, Section 1. That the city limits of the City of North Platte, Lincoln County, Nebraska, shall be as follows:

Commencing at the northwest corner of section four (4) in township thirteen (13) north, of range thirty (30) west of the 6th P. M. in Lincoln County, Nebraska, running thence south on the west line of said section to the southwest corner of Block seventeen (17) of residence Park Subdivision, as the same is platted and recorded in the office of the county clerk of Lincoln County, Nebraska; thence east along the south line of Residence Park Subdivision to the southeast corner of Block Twenty (20) of said Residence Park Subdivision; thence south along the west line of South Willow Street to the north line of Phillip Avenue, as shown on the recorded plat of Graceland Addition in the office of the County Clerk of Lincoln County, Nebraska; thence east along the north line of said Phillip Avenue to the place of intersection of the north line of said Phillip Avenue with the west line of South Locust Street, thence north to the place where the said west line of said South Locust Street intersects the north line of the Suburban Irrigation District right of way; thence east along the north line of said Suburban Irrigation District right of way to the southeast corner of Block sixteen (16) in Taylor's Addition to the City of North Platte, Nebraska, as the same is platted and recorded in the office of the county clerk of Lincoln County, Nebraska; thence north along the east line of Taylor's Addition, and Peniston's Addition to the City of North Platte, Nebraska, to the place on said line extended where it intersects the north line of Section Four (4) in township thirteen (13) North, of range thirty (30) west of the 6th P. M., thence east along the north line of said Section four (4) in township thirteen (13), north of range thirty (30) west of the 6th P. M. to the point where said north line of said Section four (4) intersects the south lines of East Second Street as shown by the recorded plat thereof; thence East along the South line of said Second Street to the point where the south line of said Second Street intersects the east line of Bryan Avenue; thence north along the east line of Bryan Avenue to a point where the east line of said Bryan Avenue if extended, intersects the southeast corner of plat of land owned by Union Stock Yards, thence west along the south line of said tract of land owned by said Union Stock Yards to the place where said line intersects the east line of Section thirty-three (33) in township fourteen (14) north of range thirty (30) thence north along the east line of said section thirty-three (33) to a point where said east line of said section thirty-three (33) intersects the north line of East 8th Street in the City of North Platte, Lincoln County, Nebraska; thence

west along the north line of said 8th Street to a point where the north line of said 8th street intersects the east line of North Cottonwood Street in said City of North Platte, Nebraska; thence north along the east line of said North Cottonwood Street to a point where the east line of said Cottonwood Street would meet the north line of East 12th street extended; thence west along the north line of said East 12th street extended to the southwest corner of Lot thirteen (13) in Isaac Dillon's Subdivision; thence north along the west line of said lot thirteen (13) of said Isaac Dillon's Subdivision to the north line of said Section thirty-three (33) in township fourteen (14), North of range thirty (30), thence east along the north line of said section to the Northeast corner of said Section; thence north along the east line of Section twenty-eight (28) in township fourteen (14) north, of range thirty (30) west of the 6th P. M. to the point where said east line intersects the south bank of the North Platte River; thence west on the south bank of said North Platte River to the place where the east line of the County Road which crosses the said North Platte River in said Section twenty-eight (28) intersects the south line of the North Platte River; thence south along the east line of said county road to a point where said east line of said County Road intersects the north line of Section thirty-three (33) in township fourteen (14) north, of range thirty (30); thence west along the north line of said section thirty-three (33) to the northwest corner of the northeast quarter (NE¼) of the northeast quarter (NE¼) of section thirty-two (32) in township fourteen (14), North of Range thirty (30); thence south along the west line of said northeast quarter (NE¼) of the Northeast quarter (NE¼) of the Northeast quarter (NE¼) of said Section thirty-two (32) to the northeast corner of the south half (S½) of the northwest quarter (NW¼) of the Northeast quarter (NE¼) of Section Thirty-two (32), thence west along the north line of the south half (S½) of the Northwest quarter (NW¼) of the Northeast quarter (NE¼) of Section Thirty-two (32) to a point where said line intersects the north line of Dolson's Addition to the city of North Platte, Nebraska; thence west along the north line of said Dolson's Addition to a point where said north line of said Dolson's Addition intersects the west line of the northeast quarter (NE¼) of the said Section Thirty-two (32); thence south along said west line of northeast quarter (NE¼) of Section thirty-two (32) to the place where said west line of the said northeast quarter (NE¼) of Section Thirty-two (32) intersects the north line of Block One (1) of the Cody Addition to North Platte, Lincoln County, Nebraska; thence west along the north line of said Cody Addition to North Platte, Nebraska, and along the north line of Cody's Second Addition to North Platte, Nebraska, to the northwest corner of Block Two (2), of Cody's Second Addition to North Platte, Nebraska, thence south along the east line of Emery Avenue to the point where said east line of said Emery Avenue intersects the south line of West 2nd Street; thence east along the south line of said West 2nd street to the place where said south line of said West 2nd Street intersects the east line of said Section thirty-two (32) in township fourteen (14) North of Range thirty (30), thence south on the east line of said Section thirty-two (32), to the Northwest corner of Section four (4) in township thirteen (13), North of Range thirty (30) west of the 6th P. M.

Section 2. That ordinance No. 111 of the City of North Platte, Nebraska, as passed on the 20th day of January, 1920 defining the limits of said city, and all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage according to law.
