Several years later Mrs. Johnson and her sons, James and Herman, came to this country, reaching North Platte on June 5, 1888. They took a homestead about nine miles southeast of here and Mrs. Johnson has lived there consinuously for almost 35 years.

Only one son is left to revere her memory. Other near relatives are two daughters-in-law, eight grandchildren, three great-grandchfidren, one sister, Mrs. Anna S. Carlson of this city, and one brother, Fred Peterson of Ashland, Wis.

At the age of 16 she was confirmed in the Lutheran church and has always lived a Christian life, her Bible and hymn book being her daily companions.

The funeral services were held on Sunday afternoon, February 19, at 2:30 from the Pleasant View school house on Jack Morrow flats, and were in charge of Rev. C. F.
