Mrs. Asa Snyder, living on west ninth street entertained at a high-five party Saturday evening. A fine hot supper was served to the guests at midnight.


The petition asking for the nomination of Mrs. Ray Snyder as a member of the board of education to succeed herself has been circulated in the fourth ward and has more than enough signers.

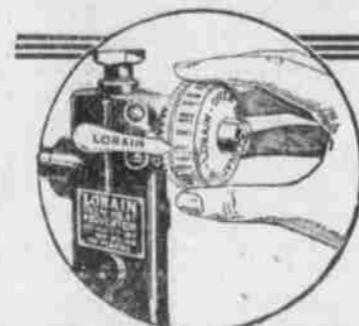
