Beverly Wurtele returned home from Omaha where she attends Brownell Hall. She will spend the vacation with her parents Dr. and Mrs. Wurtele.

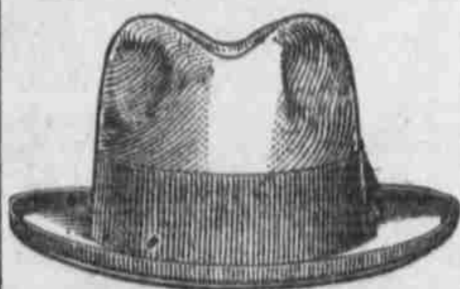
