**SPECIAL FILM OF LOUISIANA OIL FIELDS TO BE SHOWN AT KEITH**

Throughout the trip the rain poured down in torrents. The roads were practically impassable. Swirling eddies in the water-glazed mire might even have caused the hardened mariner to hesitate. Their sedan, however, went forward steadily. They reached their destination."
