She, with her husband, moved to Iowa in 1854, locating on a farm near Mount Pleasant, lowa, near the town of Hillsboro, Her husband having anlisted in the U. S. Army, Company "C" 25th Voluteer Infantry, left for the war, serving about two years. The farm and business of her husband was left entirely in her hands, also the care of the family consisting of three small children. 


