6,000,000 MOTOR

NEXT ONE COMES THROUGH BUT 5 1-3 SECONDS LATER

Ford Motor Number 6,000,000 was lifted from the assembly line in Highland Park Ford Plant at 9:14 a. m., May 18th. Just 5 1-3 seconds later Number 6,000,001 was finished.

The unusually heavy demand for Ford cars and Trucks at the present

time has necessitated the building of 5400 motors daily. These are shipped in carload lots to the various Ford assembling plants throughout the United States.

The first Model "T" Ford Motor was completed on October 1st, 1908; number 1,000,000 left the assembly line December 10th, 1915; and number 5,000,000 came through May 28th, 1921.
