BARN LOTS EACH YEAR /

Hog raisers may accomplish two when here last week, that the Indians barn lots at least once a year, says thruout the hotel. We now have the United States Department of Agriculture. In the first place, hogs need good succulent pasture as much of the time as possible, and in the second place they need protection against internal parasites, such as roundworms, the eggs of which remain in the soil. Turning over the soil in the lots helps to get rid of the pests and the crop of forage makes it a profitable operation. In addition to providing cheap protein feed, pasture crops aid as a laxative and require the hogs to take a certain amount of exercise which is necessary to breed-

> Rye is probably the best crop to belt it may be sown from August 20 to about October 1, depending on the latitude. In warmer climates the crop By putting in successive plantings from 2 to 4 weeks apart it is possible to have fresh pasture all the time Seeding for pasture should be much to 4 bushels per acre on a good soil. Pasturing can probably begin 6 weeks after seeding, and may continue, if the rye is not covered with snow until the following April.
