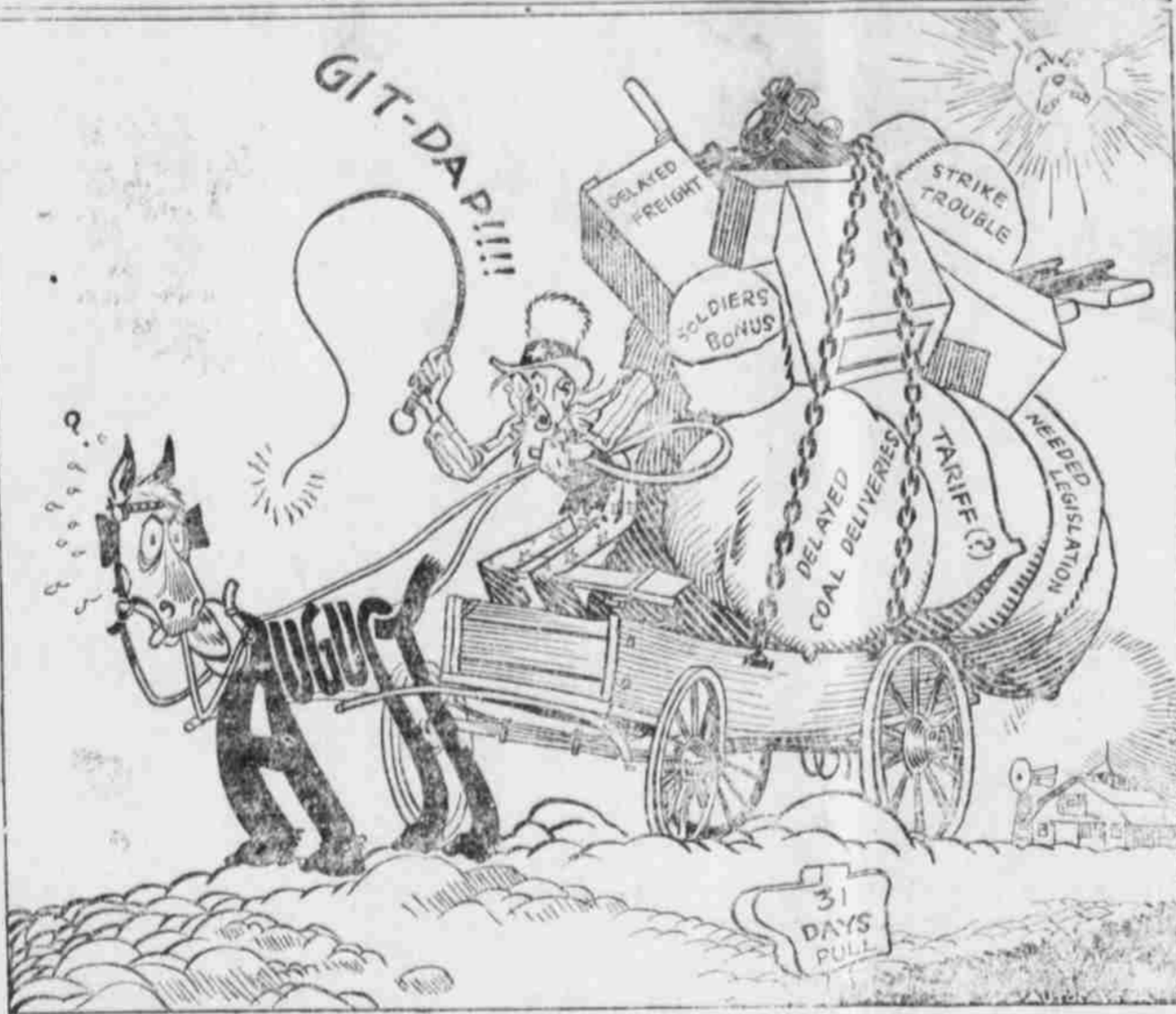
MANY PEOPLE PLAN TO ATTEND PLATTE VALLEY ROUND-UP

Several hundred North Platte people are planning on spending one or more days at the Platte Valley Round-Up to be held on Birdwood creek, sixteen miles north of Sutherland, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of next week. One thing that can be said in favor of this rodeo, is that many of the participants will be real old time cowboys and not professional riders such as you see at most of the round-ups these days—men who actually rode the range, who know what a grub wagon was, who ransled wild horses before the first barbed wire fence was stretched across the plains. We refer to such men as Nate Trego Bert and John Snyder, John Schick, Riley Haskell, John Harshfield, the Coker boys and a dozen others this writer knew in the days when a round-up meant the gathering up of ten, twenty or thirty thousand head of cattle belonging to ranchmen living all the way between the Colorado and Wyoming lines and old Plum Creek. And believe us those boys could ride, and rope, and throw a steer, and use a branding iron—and they became adept because it was part of their days work.
