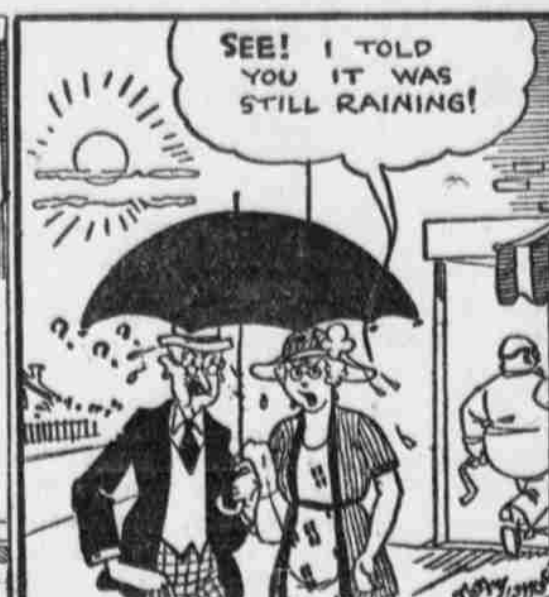

KEARNEY IS INTERESTED IN THE PROSPECTS OF FINDING CRUDE OIL

The following clipped from the Kearney Hub gives both sensible and fantastic information about possible oil wells at or near Kearney. It was taken from the Hub.

During the past few days all of us have become somewhat familiar with the Teapot Dome, because of the possibility of piping oil from that naval reserve on through Kearney to Kansas City.

The famed Lance creek field of Wyoming, the Burbennett, Texas, oil floods and Mexican Pete are not unknown in this country of jitneys. Possibly there are some of us operating those jitneys on incomes derived from these very oil fields. Owners contributed to sustain exploiters and developers and stock salesmen who affably claimed acquaintanceship with the most fickle and elusive of all fortune makers, oil. It's a great game, with the wide world the limit and none barred. Oil has been found on the ocean's strand, witness Baku. Desertless wastes have disgorged fortunes, as in Texas, the rocky shores of Tampico have produced scores of millionaire oil barons and the naval reserves will add their quota to the list.

Alliance, Roseand, Campbell and a score of cities, towns and villages in Nebraska have their oil prospect and are prospecting. Even humble Gibbon, which boasts modestly and justly of having the finest little tourist park in the state has taken a flyer at oil. Why not Kearney?

Why not? Of course it comes high. It's a game of big stakes, no limit. But then there is a prospect and an oil prospect means prospecting. In terms of dollars and cents it depends entirely upon how deep you want to go, into your jeans and into the earth.

Natives have become all excited within the past few days over a discovery of oil in Kearney. Lately some evidences of it have been found at the Herbert gravel pit. It is unquestionably oil. Further traces are to be found along the entire length of the Walker channel, for miles both east and west of Central Ave. Farmers have seen evidences of it from time to time, looked it over and then went about the business of the day, raising corn to raise hogs to raise money to lift the family mortgage. But ever so often there comes a time to have a fling at fickle fortune and may be the time is at hand.

Within the past two days as many oil experts, working their scientific knowledge or the divining rod, have examined lands in and about the Herbert gravel pit. They both agree oil was evidence there, one felt certain it would be found in abundance at thirty-two hundred feet down. He estimated a pocket existed there somewhere, one that would yield untold wealth if tapped. Tapping sounds simple and is not a very complicated matter, except in dollars and cents. For to sink a well down to thirty-two hundred feet would in-

volve an expenditure of about fifty-thousand dollars of someone's good money. Of course, were a strike made that would be only a drop in a pool of oil.

It is quite needless to say that others than the owners of the lands in question are interested, intensely so. In fact every man, woman and child in Kearney, it is believed, would welcome with real sincerity the incoming of about a five thousand barrel gusher on any acreage immediately tributary to or within the city of Kearney.

But however enthused the crowd is getting, those who are most closely affected by this rediscovery of oil in the valley and along the river bottom, are maintaining a cool front, visualizing the possibilities but not losing sight of the fact that their chances of realizing are merely speculative. They are weighing the chances carefully and painstakingly before undertaking a financial plunge into the oil pool.

If further and thorough examination reveals such existing conditions as would warrant and encourage the sinking of a test well, it may be done, the Hub is informed, but until such time those interested are not letting their enthusiasm back their judgement off into a maze of speculative oil pools.

Some of you, no doubt large numbers, have read of some of the things done at Mooseheart in the interest of humanity by the Loyal Order of Moose Lodge for their aged and orphans as well as others who are in a position to benefit by the activities of the Moose Lodge at Mooseheart. Well, these things are just the things that will be accomplished by the Brotherhood of American Yeomen in the Home which they are now contemplating. Schools, athletics, agriculture, landscape beautifying, entertainment and care for the aged and infirm, tutoring of the orphan young and—well the Home means a regular

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500 to 600 Cattle At Auction Monday, Sept. 4th, 1922. at North Platte Stock Yards.

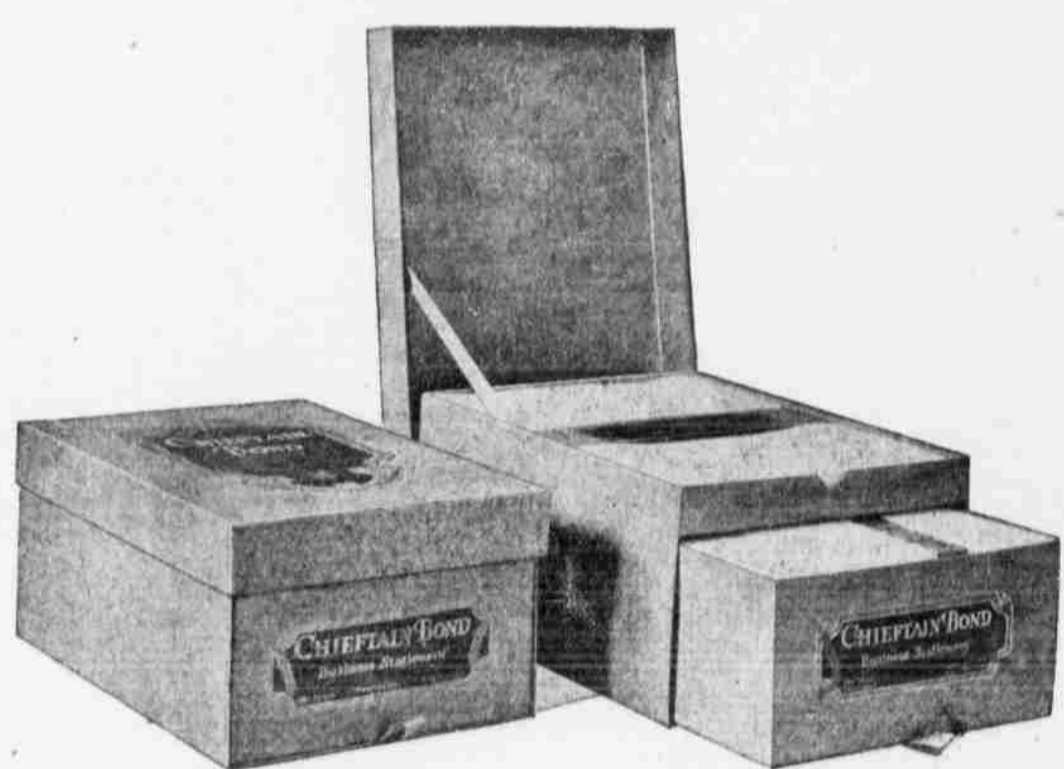
These Cattle will sell in car load lots. Part of them will sell freight paid to the river, feed and transit on any branch of the main line.
