To The Editor.

The Eighteenth Amendment and the Volstead act is morally wrong, contrary to the Constitution, conducive to evil effects and economic disturbance and dangerous to American Institutions. Man is morally possessed of the right to life, the power of choice and free unrestricted will, the use of things that make life and living, and having physical senses, the natural right to gratify them and the right to select and choose, subject to the corresponding obligations against abuse, subject to the laws of human reason; and provided further, that the exercise of such natural right does not trespass upon the natural rights of others or shock the reasonable sensibilities of others.

Man has the natural right to produce and use alcoholic liquors, subject to regulation where abuses are found. The Constitution rests on natural rights, and the Eighteenth Amendment by depriving the individual of the right to select and choose without restraint tends to nullify it.

The Eighteenth Amendment having passed by constituted authority should be obeyed as long as it is law, but the temptation for infraction was serious and general. Disrespect for Federal laws is dangerous to the Constitution, wrong in itself and strikes at the foundation of our Government.

The Government violated this law when it permitted the dispensation of liquors on the American ships, thru the shipping board.

Statistics show a decrease in arrests for abuse, and an increase for abuse and an increase in arrests for manufacture of liquors, the sum total being about the same. Public abuse could be regulated but it seems that surreptitious abuse was impractical to reach.

It is apparent, that the means adopted to secure temperance resulted in more evil than the good end desired and as no end however good can be justified by means not entirely good prohibition as such is not defensible since it can only deal with abuse, which are entirely matters of regulation.

Economic effect—economically, the sum total of the material, wages and salaries, and invested capital and yearly profits was \$2,250,867,280.00.

The danger is that the Amendments such as the Eighteenth and laws such as the Volstead act, logically and completely carried to conclusion in other things were the straight road to bureaucracy, paternalism, communism and complete collapse, or monarchy.

The remedy is the joining of all forces of good going back to liberty and the Constitution and uninfluenced representative government, the building of good character in youth, by example training and moral suasion, and the sanctity of home and Sunday school.
