### NOTES ON THE PROGRESS AND INCIDENTS OF THE MEETING

Tonight is Mother's night. Every person who attends the meeting is asked to wear a white or red flower or ribbon—for a mother who is living and a white for a mother who has gone. There will be special music and a special sermon.

Saturday night will be children's night again and there will be songs and stunts by the boys and girls. Following these Mr. Fraser will deliver a brief sermon appropriate to the occasion.

Wednesday night was the first time the invitation was given to those who sought conversion and over seventy-five young and old people went forward. Ten more went forward last night.

Mr. Fraser's voice has been taxed to capacity this last week and he has called on local musicians to help him in the singing. Last night a male quartet sang three numbers and tonight Mrs. M. H. Gilfoyl will sing one or more solos.

The attendance at the ten o'clock morning prayer meetings has steadily increased until yesterday morning when there were 167 people present. That is the total for ten or more meetings. The number present today was expected to be still larger.

Sunday is expected to be the closing day of the meetings. The regular morning services will be held in each of the churches and the young people's meetings will be held in the early evening as usual. Then at 7:30 the union service will begin with Mr. Fraser in charge. He will give a sermon fitting the close of the four week's campaign. A large attendance is expected.

Wednesday night was Sunday school night and the church was crowded to capacity. The Sunday Schools met in their respective churches at seven o'clock and in turn joined in the march which included each of the churches in turn. The line marched down Dewey street to the Methodist church where the night meetings are held. It was a noisy, merry throng that filled the church and sang songs for Mr. Fraser.

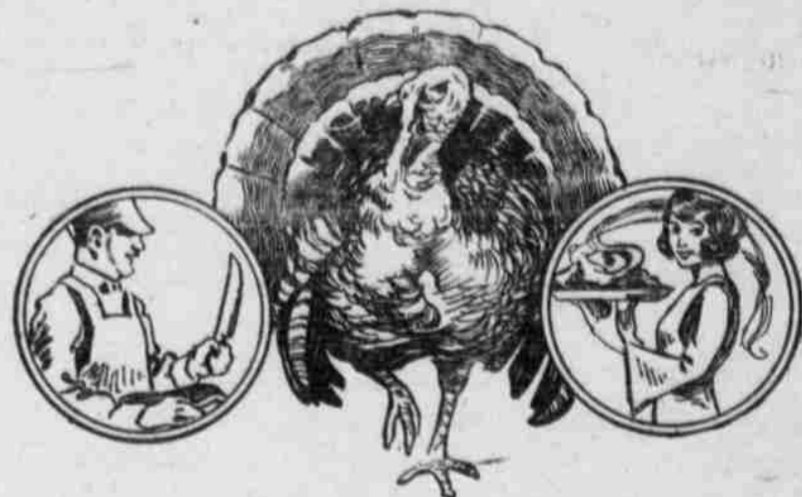
