Nearly two-thirds of the butter produced in the United States in 1921 was made in creameries, according to a report of the United States Department of Agriculture.

Of the leading markets New York is often quoted as paying the highest prices for very early arrivals of fruits and vegetables, but during the height of the season is often quoted below the others, says the United States Department of Agriculture.

The alfalfa acreage of Michigan increased over 20,000 acres this year following alfalfa campaigns conducted the past winter by agricultural extension workers in that state according to reports to the United States Department of Agriculture.

Farmers last year entered over 194,000 cows in cow-testing associations to determine their standing as butter-fat producers through demonstrations by agricultural extension workers, according to reports to the United States Department of Agriculture.

Over 9,450,000 pounds of meat cured 2,600,000 pounds of lard, and 3,900,000 pounds of sausage made in 1921 in farm homes where none had been made before are reported to the United States Department of Agriculture as the result of demonstrations in meat conservation by home demonstration agents.

Shipments of sheep and lambs back to the country for feeding showed an increase during the first nine months of this year of 355,000 head, or more than 21 per cent, over the corresponding period of last year, although there was a decrease in market receipts of 2,206,000 head, or nearly 13 per cent, according to a report of the United States Department of Agriculture.

A Mississippi farm woman told at a recent short course at the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Mississippi how she had made \$150 this year from a single Easter lily given to her nine years ago. With the help and advice of the county extension agent that lily was planted and grown out of doors until, according to reports received by the United States Department of Agriculture, a regular business has been built up, with a steady demand for the lilies.

Production of potatoes this year in 16 countries is estimated to be 765,000,000 bushels more than last year and 40,000,000 more than the average production for the five years 1909-1913, according to figures compiled by the United States Department of Agriculture. The bad results of carelessness in leaving breaks in the basement walls of a building originally intended to be rat proof are shown in a case recently reported to the Biological Survey of the United States Department of Agriculture. In the course of a rat campaign in Portland, Ore., in which the rodent-control men from the department were backed by the city bureau of health and the chamber of commerce, a building with unrepaired breaks of this sort was visited. The owner was advised to clean up all the rubbish in his basement, repair the breaks in the cement wall, use barium carbonate on Hamburg steak to poison the rats, and also to set some traps. A few days later it was learned that in removing the trash three rat nests were uncovered, one of which contained 15 young. Thirty-six adult rats were found dead the morning after the poison was spread.

MANY KINDS OF SHORE BIRDS ARE PROTECTED BY THE STATES

The open season for hunting black-bellied and golden plovers and greater and lesser yellowlegs varies in the different states, the earliest opening date being August 16 for Maine, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, New York, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland and Virginia, according to an announcement issued by the Biological Survey, United States Department of Agriculture. In Connecticut, the District of Columbia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Arkansas, Oklahoma and New Mexico the season on these birds open September 1.

In other states the open season begins at various dates after September 1. A closed season throughout the year prevails in all states on all other shore-birds, including avocets, curlews, dowitchers, godwits, knots, oyster catchers, partridges, sandpipers, stilts, surf birds, turnstones, willets and all plovers and snipes other than golden and black-bellied plovers and Wilson snipe or jacksnipes. Practically all States require hunters to obtain State hunting licenses.

Greater and lesser yellowlegs and black-bellied plover are reported plentiful this year, and excellent shooting should be found at many places on the Atlantic coast and along inland rivers and bays throughout their range, where good feeding grounds are located.

PRESIDENT HARDING ESTABLISHES NEW WILD BIRD RESERVATION

A 40-acre tract adjoining the elk refuge near Jackson, Wyo., has been established as a new national bird reservation by Executive order. It will be known as the Flat Creek Reservation, and will serve throughout the year as a breeding and resting place for the wild fowl and other birds of the region. Late in fall and in winter it will serve another purpose in affording additional pasture to the elk herds coming down from the mountains in and about the Yellowstone National Park to winter in the Jackson Hole region. Both the elk refuge and the Flat Creek Reservation are under the jurisdiction of the Biological Survey of the United States Department of Agriculture.

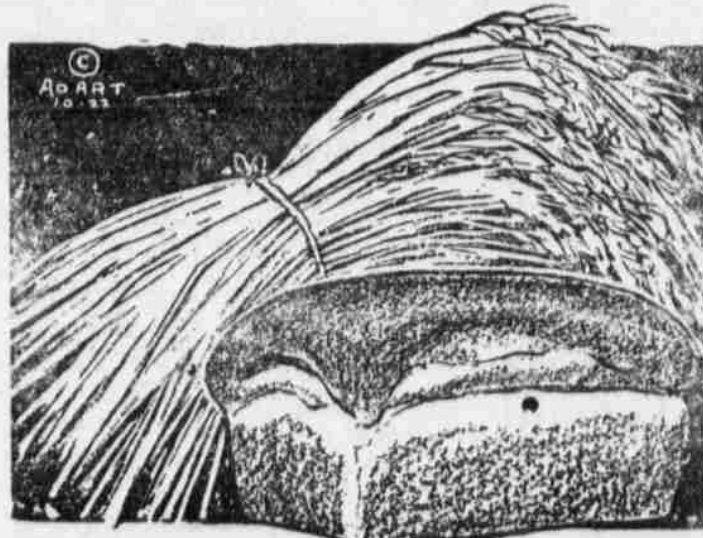

RECORDS OF WEATHER BUREAU SETTLE MANY DISPUTES OUT OF COURT

Over 90% of cases involving the loss of goods in transit, particularly perishables, for which weather conditions may be responsible, are settled without ever coming into court, after consultation with the Weather Bureau of the United States Department of Agriculture. The report of the Weather Bureau as to its records of temperature and other conditions along the route in question is usually accepted as final in such disputes. Sometimes the shipper and sometimes the railroad or steamship line is the one to ask for the evidence of the Weather Bureau, but both sides accept the impartial records in the Government files.
