County Commissioners.

Official Proceedings of That Body at Their Last Meeting.

County commissioners met April 14, 1896, pursuant to adjournment. All members present.

The following business was transacted:

Ferry License was granted to W. H. Lemon of St. Deroiin for the sum of \$5 for one year from April 26, 1896.

Skiff ferry license was granted to Joseph McClary of Brownville for the sum of \$2 for one year from date.

The treasurer was ordered to strike from the list all poll tax assessed against Harry B. Woodring for the year 1895.

Board adjourned to April 15.

April 15. The road petition of Hurnick S'uffer for the location of a public road between sections 4 and 5, and 16 and 17, township 4 range 13, was disallowed.

The road petition of August Krounce for a county road on township line between Benton and Washington precincts was granted and the road ordered located.

The following orders were made to the treasurer:

To compute and collect taxes on the southwest quarter of southeast quarter of section 17, township 6, range 14, on a valuation of \$100 instead of \$210 as returned by the assessor.

To compute the taxes on lot 1 of 1 of 8 of the southeast quarter of section 7 township 5 range 13 for the year 1893, on a valuation of \$225, said tax having been paid under protest, and refund the balance of said tax so protested.

To refund six and fourteen-one-hundredths (\$6.14) dollars on tax receipt 597, paid under protest by J. L. Seigner.

Board adjourned to April 16.

April 16. Lots 1 and 2 block 55, Peru, was ordered sold for delinquent taxes.

The following orders were made to the treasurer:

To refund to H. T. W. Fritch \$3 on account of error in computing tax list.

To receive taxes assessed against Katie Daugherty for the year 1895 on a valuation of \$1,674 instead of \$2,430 as returned by the assessor.

To refund the poll tax assessed against George Berauson and paid under protest, he being over 50 years of age.

To transfer the taxes on the north half of southeast quarter of section 13 township 5 range 16, also lot 6 of same quarter, from school district 35 to school district 36, and correct the error.

To compute the personal taxes of Julia A. Hughes on a valuation of \$381 instead of \$505 for the year 1894.

To transfer the assessment of 1895 on the northeast quarter of section 14 township 5 range 12 from school district 80 to school district 21, where it belongs, and compute taxes at 15 instead of 22 mills.

To correct and collect the personal taxes of Bohling and Rohrs as per order.

The official bond of James Cowell, road supervisor of district 41, was approved.

The settlement of Casner Barnes, road supervisor of district 34, was examined and approved.

W. H. Lohr was appointed justice of the peace and George Taylor appointed constable to fill vacancy in Bedford precinct.

The claims of Henry Adams for \$10.50 and W. E. Adams for \$3 were disallowed.
