

MEMORIAL SERVICES.
According to previous arrangement,
memorial services were held at the
opera house last Saturday. It was
about 2 o'clock when the service began.
The singing was good. Rev. John T.
Smith, of Nemaha City, delivered one
of the best addresses we ever heard. It
was fine from beginning to end, and
elicited warm praise from every one
we heard speak of it. After the ser-
vice at the hall the procession was
formed, headed by the G. A. R. post,
and proceeded to the cemetery, where
the graves of the dead soldiers were
decorated with flowers. A class of
little girls from the primary depart-
ment of our schools acted as flower
girls.

W. H. Rider has had an experience
that few men ever had. He has some
leaves that were picked from plants
growing on his grave. He was home
on a furlough during the late war
when 14 copperheads waylaid him
one dark night and tried to kill him.
So sure were they of their success
that they dug the grave beforehand.
Mr. Rider escaped without injury,

coat. Mr. Rider was at that time liv-
ing with his parents, in northern In-
diana. A few years ago his sister
was visiting in that neighborhood and
went to the place where the grave had
been dug. The sunken place was
still plainly to be seen. She plucked
some leaves from plants growing
thereon and brought them out to Mr.
Rider, who kept them in memory of
his narrow escape.
