It's McKinley and Hobart
Both Nominated on First
Ballot.

Thursday afternoon the republican
national convention at St. Louis nomi-
nated the next president of the United
States—William McKinley, of Ohio.
He received 661½ votes out of a total
of 906. Garrett A. Hobart, of New
Jersey, was nominated for vice presi-
dent on the first ballot, receiving 535½
votes.

John M. Thurston, as permanent
chairman, won universal praise.
