The election in Nemaha precinct resulted in a victory for the republicans, every republican candidate receiving a Maxwell r 124; Atther Paris i d 99; G majority with the exception of two N Titus r 126; Webber i d 92. road everseers. The election board consisted of W T Russell, James A Titus and Chas Anderson as judges of election and W W Sanders and Chas F Zook as clerks of election. On account of the lengthy ticket and the amendments the count was not completed until after six o'clock Wednesday morning. Two hundred and thirtynine votes were cast.
