War has virtually been declared be ween Spain and the United States The Spanish minister, upon the deliv ery of the resolutions adopted by con-
gress and the president's ultimatum, asess and the president's ultimatum,

United States Minister Woodford was given his pass ports Thorsday, by the Spanish government, thus severing diplomatic intercourse between the two nations. An armed squadron has been sent by this country to blockade Havana, and the tercept the Spanish flotilla at Port Rico. The house has passed a bill empowering the president to call for vol unteers, and he will issue a call for 100,000 volunteers as soon as the bill passes the senate and bocomes a law.
