#### Nebraska's First Daily Paper.

The News has always claimed that it was the old at daily paper in Nebraska, either during territor at t mes or since the admission of Nebraska into the Union as a state. However the history of Nebraska teaches that the News was not, but that Brown ville, Nemaha county, has the distinguished honor of publishing the first daily paper in the territorial times. For a few weeks in 1857 a small daily sheet named the Snort was issued from the Advertiser office under the editorial supervision of Langdon & Goff, the latter now being a resident o this city, Judge D. T. Goff. "Old Rye" was a legal tender in payment of subscriptions. A score of issues was enough to send the little paper to the tomb of Capulets. The Snort was the first daily paper ever issued in Nebraska,-Nebraska City Press.


