The suit which was brought by the state of Missouri for a portion of land which is claimed as a part of Nema a county, Nebr., will be heard in the United States supreme court on Monday, April 2. The suit began last Oc and cheerfulness soon tober and the first petition was filed by the attorney general of Missouri a week ago. United states Marshal Mathe 8 was in the city last evening for the purpose of serving a subporna on Governor Poynter as Nebraska's official head Marshal Mathews left for Omaha this morning to serve a similar paper upon Attorney General Smythe. The land is a 16,000 acre tract which was cut off from the Nebraska side of he Missouri fiver by a change in the channel. 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
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
