curiously twisted specimens of wood all native kinds, and on the inside of this lattice-work over eneventy canes
the standing. each a different kind of wood grown in this county and neariy all within a mile of Nemaha. The
canes are niccoly polished and var canes are nicicly polisbed and varnistied. In the center of the platform is a larke arm chair made from native of curiously formed wood ingeniously Interwoven Mr. Hoover was many yeara making the collection, manufacy uring the canes and putting together the chair and platform. He is probaby the beat posted man in Nebraska on native woods.
