

· Passengers on ocean liners may soor be able to sleep in life preservers, ac cording to the plans of E. Salvator, s New York inventor. To sleep with a cork jacket on is out of the question. to the inventor decided to make a preserver that would become effective only by it coming in contact with the water. It works on the principle of a water generated gas, which fills a belt and gives it buoyancy. Uninflated, the belt is a light thing, which would hardly be felt if worn by a sleeper, but when filled with gas it is blown up to the size of an ordinary of fulling hair, for softening, whitencork jacket.
