The insertion in a renewal lease of a clause giving the tenant the right to emove trade fixtures is held, in Raley vs. McCurdy (Pa.), 67 L. R. A. 359. not to be necessary to enable him to remove, before the termination of the extended period, fixtures which he might have removed before the expiration of the original term.

One who employs a person in ignorance of the fact that he is under a time contract to work for another, in violation of which he has left the latter's service, is held in Wolf vs. New Orleans Tallor-Made Pants Co. (La.), 37 L. R. A. 65, not to be liable in damages to the former employer because when informed of the servant's breach of contract he falls to discharge him. since, though offering to release his new employer, he expresses his determination not to return to the one whose service he has abandoned.

A Supreme Court which has arrested a judgment of conviction in a criminal case because of a fatal defect in the indictment as presented to it, is held, in State vs. March (N. C.), 67 L. R. A. 179, to have the power, even after the close of the term, to grant the State in opportunity to correct the record so as to show that the alleged defect did not exist and proceed to hear the appeal upon the correct record. The amendment of a record to cure defect for which motion in arrest of judgment has been made is the object of a note to this case.
