

## NEMAHA COUNTY DEMOCRATIC

Nemaha county went democratic Tuesday. Bryan got 99 majority, Shallenberger 50, Maguire for congress 111.

On the county ticket Majors got a majority over Dundas of 930 in Nemaha county and between 500 and 600 majority in Johnson county. He is the only republican carrying the county.

Hector gets a plurality of 110, Ben Skeen 158. Charley Pool, for float representative, carried Nemaha county by 32 and Johnson by 42.

For county attorney Lambert is re-elected by 60.

Casey is elected county commissioner by a majority of 336, getting the largest majority of any candidate except Colonel Majors.

## IT IS TAFT

Taft was elected president by an immense majority. Missouri and Maryland are very close with indications favoring Taft. Colorado and Nevada went for Bryan by a narrow margin. Counting Missouri and Maryland in the Taft column, he has 327 electoral votes and Bryan 156. In 1900 Bryan had 155 electoral votes and McKinley 292. In 1896 Bryan had 176 electoral votes and McKinley 271.

Hughes was elected governor of New York and Hadley of Missouri. The democrats elected the governors in Ohio, Indiana and Minnesota, although these states went for Taft.

Congress will be republican by about the same majority as at present.

## Nebraska Goes Democratic

Bryan carries Nebraska by a plurality of probably 10,000. The entire state ticket is elected, Shallenberger's majority being probably 12,000. The democrats are sure of five congressmen. Pollard, in the First district, was defeated by about 800. The legislature is strongly democratic.
