"That would not do, sir. Here is the ordinance. Before you can telephone to him you must inform him beforehand by letter, telegraph or in any other way."

'Nonsense! Is the government ernzy? Maybe they ask me to travel to Galatz and inform him that on a certain day and hour he may be at the telephone office to receive a communication from me?"

"Yes, that would do, too," the official said.


