In this case place your card with the holiday greetings written thereon in a sealed envelope carefully addressed to the name and residence of the person for whom it is sent. And then ask the clerk to remove the price tag from the article purchased, and give special orders that the cost check shall not be sent with the package. At all the large shops preparation is made for this, and the vulgarity of sending a gift with the price in evidence is never committed.
