Salt in the United States. There were 11,435,487 barrels of salt produced in the United States in the year 1893, as against 11,785,754 barrels in 1892—a falling off of 350,267 barrels. Each barrel weighed 280 pounds, making a total of 3,201,936,360 pounds. In addition to this there were importations of 391,966,537 pounds, so that this country counteracted the effects of the enormous quantities of sugar used by making way with 3,593,902,897 pounds or about 1,706,951 tons of salt.
