MASSACRED BY TURKS.

SOFIA, Bulgaria, Nov. 15.—The report received by the London Daily News from Constantinople Monday that 3,000 Armenians, including women and children, had been massacred in the Sassoun region near Moosh, Turkish Armenia, during a recent attack by Kurds, is seemingly confirmed by a story which has reached Varna that a force of Bashi-Bazouks raided a number of Armenian villages and killed and wounded 6,000 persons.

ANOTHER BOND CALL.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—The issue of \$50,000,000 in bonds, which the president decided upon and for which Secretary Carlisle, despite his previously declared purpose not to do so until congress should act, issued a circular inviting bids last night, will ease present treasury conditions, but will not afford permanent relief, and there is reason to believe that the president and the secretary will submit most important suggestions on this need to congress in December.
