For example, one of the most conspicuous and fatal propositions of the Chicago platform is the proposition to abolish the right of private contract with respect to money. That is to say, it proposes to make illegal and uncollectable any con tract, evidenced by note, mortgage, bond or other instrument, to pay a particular kind of money, and especially to pay gold. But Mexico, although it legally has free silver monometallism by reason of free coinage, maintains and always has maintained, the wise policy of permitting private contracts. citizens and denizens of Mexico may Bushnell for a second term, and the use the gold standard in their private contracts and the courts will enforce payment.






