

DEAD The remaines of H. V. Waid, son of Mr. and Mrs. F. M. Waid, were brought to O'Neill Monday from Sault Ste Marie Mich., and Thursday interred in the

Protestent cemetery. The funeral services were held at the Presbyterian church, conducted by Rev. N. S. Lowrie. Appendicitis was the cause of Mr. Waid's death.

Sault Ste, Marie News: H. V. Waid stenographer in the employ of J. M. Jackson, resident manager for the E. D. Smith Co., died yesterday afternoon at the Sault General hospitai, as the result of an operation for appendicitis on Wednesday. Mr. Waid was troubled for over a year with appendicitis, but it was only within two weeks that he felt compelled to seek medical aid. About a week ago Mr. Waid grew worse and consented to submit to an operation. Thursday he seemed considerably better and great hopes were entertained for a speedy recovery. Yesterday, however, a change for the worse took place and he sank rapidly, death coming about 3 o'clock Mr. Waid had been a resident of this city for over a year. He came here from Chicago to enter Mr. Jackson's employ, which position he capably filled up to within a tew days of the time of his de-
