The Atkinson Plain Dealer the list of the townships of Atkinson, Dustin, Cleveland, Sand Creek, Stuart, Green Valley, Sheridan, Francis, Fairview, Wyoming and Swan, and the villages of Atkinson, Stuart and Amelia.


