In case of your failure to comply with this demand, we will apply to the district court, of said county, at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m., on the 27th day of April, 1900, for a preemptory writ of mandamus, compelling you to make such report. This demand is made through no hostility to you, but in what we regard as a proper performance of our duty as managers of the county business.

In view of reports being circulated, and for which this board is not responsible, you owe it to your self and to us, and to the people of the county to make this report.

To the county board of supervisors, Holt county. Gentlemen: On account of a misunderstanding with you as a county board, and in consideration of a request from M. H. McCarthy, chairman of the peoples independent party, and on account of disbarment proceedings begun in the district court, that I resign the office of county attorney. I hereby tender you my resignation as county attorney of Holt county, Nebr.;
Said resignation to take effect May 2, A. D. 1900.
W. R. Butler, county attorney.

In tendering this, my resignation to this board, I wish to say to the county board, and to the people of Holt county, that I have done my full duty as county attorney, according to the best of my ability. As county attorney I have done no dishonorable act. Political parties for political and private advantage, have secretly and maliciously circulated reports to the effect that I have been guilty of official misconduct, and that I am indebted to Holt county. In my judgment the best thing for me to do, for the populist party, and for myself is to resign, then as a private citizen, I will be entitled to an immediate investigation, which will mean to me a vindication. To my friends and to my bondsmen, it will be found that I have not taken a cent of county money that I was not entitled to, and that before this matter is over, it will be found that the charges against me have been made by scoundrels who desire to injure the populist party, and who, to accomplish this are willing to blacken the reputation of an honorable man for the purpose of furthering their wicked and malicious schemes.
