
A Famous Diadem.



In tendering this, my resignation to this board, I wish to say to the county board, and to the people of Holt county, that I have done my full duty as county attorney, according to the best of my ability. As county attorney I have done to all business intrusted to me; will no disbonorable act. To my friends and to my bondsmen, it will be found that I have not taken a cent of county money that I was not entitled to, and that before this matter is over, it will be found that the charges against me have been made by scoundrels who desire to injure the populist party, and who, to accomplish this are willing to blacken the reputation of an honorable man for the puragainst him and by him paid in his pose of furthering their wicked and malicious schemes.
