Trade Under Expansion.

Washington, June 6.—Senator Lodge is one of the most careful and thorough investigators of the expansion question in all of its bearings. He has just been examing its growth of our trade with Hawaii, and finds that five years ago, in 1895, the total Hawaiian trade with the United States amounted to only \$11,500, 000. Last year it reached \$33,500, 000, having increased almost three fold within five years, and most of this increase has occurred within the last eighteen months.

The senator says that we may not think that a business of \$33,500,000 amounts to very much when our foreign trade is now running up into the billions, but to compare our trade with the Hawaiian islands, with their handful of people, with our trade with some of the larger countries, gives a better idea of the value of colonies to the United
