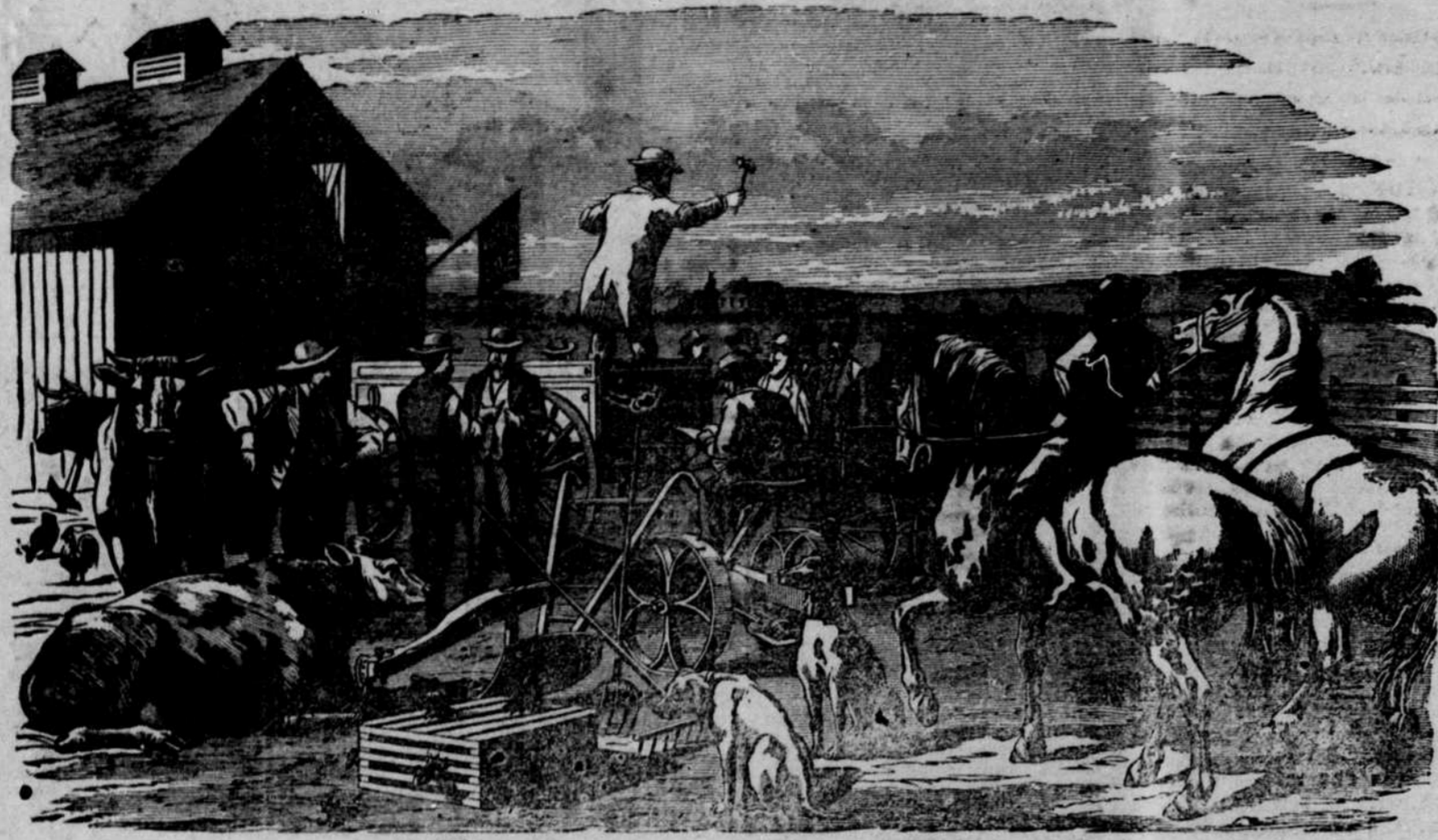

### SUPERVISORS IN REGULAR SESSION

(Official Report.)  
 The balance of the money paid into the treasury by me on April 30th 1900 as represented by the county treasurer's receipts No. 120 and 121, to-wit: The sum of \$9.04. I account for as follows: At the time of making the above report I was unable to find receipts for payments of costs in county cases, outside of county foreclosures amounting to \$9.04, but which I have found since paying same into the treasury and can produce for your inspection at any time.  
 In county trustee cases, being an action of Holt county vs the Holt county bank, in which the county attached certain tax liens held and represented by Mrs. Dwyer and which the county claimed was in fact the property of John Dwyer, one of the Holt County bank bondsmen, before the statute of limitation had run against the right to recover on these tax liens. I was made trustee for the county and have collected on these cases in which I was trustee for the county, the following amounts: The sum of \$112.18 and have paid out in costs in these cases the sum of \$112.13 said disbursements being made up as follows:

Paid sheriffs for serving summons in trustee case, as shown by receipts summons.....	\$35 10
I also hold receipts from the clerk of the district court costs paid in trustee cases.....	77 08

Said payments will be found in the office of the clerk of the district court in fee book 10, page 232 and in the same fee book on page 340.  
 In the foregoing message I have gone into detail as far as time would permit and have tried to explain matters so that you might be able to understand and get the run of these matters without having to appoint another "Special Committee." If however there is anything in this message which you, or any of you, do not clearly understand it will be a favor to me if you will come to me and give me an opportunity to make the matter of doubt clear to you.  
 You will observe that I have not gone into the matter of county foreclosures of tax liens in this report. I have not taken this matter up at this time, for the reason that I believe it would have a tendency to confuse and for the additional reason that I did not have the time to do so without neglecting county affairs.  
 Considering that I have been compelled to resign the office to which the people elected me, by your actions in heaping on me abuse, misuse and insult. I hope that you will now allow the claims I have filed against the county, amounting to the sum of \$513.29 and which sum is represented by cash advanced in county cases, civil and criminal, amount still due on salary, etc.  
 In going over the records of county foreclosures of tax liens, your special committee found and reported that I had advanced in these county cases the sum of \$131.05. That I had received in settled cases \$50.30. That there was still due me for cash advanced \$80.75, which would make the total indebtedness of Holt county to me, \$594.04 according to the report of your special committee, but the fact is that there is

now due me in these county foreclosure cases.....\$125 00 which with the amount of my claims filed..... 513 29 leaves the actual amount due me from the county.....\$638 29  
 In regard to these several amounts in county foreclosures cases I agreed with the old board and stated to you that I would never file any claim against Holt county, for any money advanced in getting service of summons in foreclosure cases, and for this reason I will never file any claim, or make any demand that the money of the tax payer of Holt county liquidate any part of the \$125 which I have so advanced and which remains unpaid at this time.  
 It is now your duty, in justice to me, and in justice to my bondsmen to appoint or employ a competent person to go over my books, vouchers, receipts and the records in the several offices of Holt county, to the end that the correctness of this report be verified, and that my bondsmen be sure that no liability on their part exists and that I be cleared of the infamous charges and from false representations heretofore circulated by yourself and other parties, as I would have suffered death by being burned at the stake before I would have abused the confidence of my people, or misused one cent of their money, all of which is respectfully submitted.
