

SUPERVISORS IN REGULAR SESSION

(Official Report.)

Supervisors' Office, O'Neill, Nebr.—9 o'clock a. m., Dec. 18, 1900.—Board met pursuant to adjournment. Present, Betha, Cooper, Coffey, Fritchhoff, Keefe, Postlewait, Simar. Minutes of previous meetings were read and approved.

John Jenkins appeared before the board in behalf of S. O. Stillman, owner of the townsite of Grand Rapids, and offered to pay the sum of \$50 in settlement of taxes and penalties assessed against certain lots in the town of Grand Rapids for the year of 1888 and subsequent years and which said taxes and penalties now amount to about \$600. Said offer was taken under advisement.

County Attorney-elect A. F. Mullen came before the board with the request that they provide an office room for him.

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
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
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
