#### LEGAL ADVERTISEMENTS.

##### LEGAL NOTICE.

The unknown heirs of William H. Bice, deceased, non-resident defendant, and the southeast quarter of section ten west of the thirty, north of range ten west of the sixth principal meridian in Holt county, Nebraska, will take notice that on the 22nd day of March, A. D. 1901, M. P. Kinkaid as administrator upon the estate of Helen A. Berry, deceased, as plaintiff, filed his petition in the district court of Holt county, Nebraska, against the unknown heirs of William H. Bice, deceased, and the southeast quarter of section ten, township thirty, north of range ten west of the sixth principal meridian in Holt county, Nebraska, which lien was purchased by E. W. Adams of the county treasurer of Holt county, Nebraska, at a private tax sale for the delinquent taxes due and owing thereon for the year 1888, and for the payment by virtue of said tax sale purchase, of the subsequent taxes when delinquent for the years of 1889, 1890, 1891 and 1892, which taxes for all of said years were duly assessed for taxation in said county, the amount paid at said tax sale purchase being \$26.86, and the taxes for 1889 \$29.72; for 1890 \$10.27, and for 1891, \$12.35, and for 1892, \$8.81, and giving notice to the owner and occupier of said premises to redeem same from such lien there was reasonably said four dollars and fifty cents, the first cause of action to be due him the sum of \$39.00.

For a second and supplemental cause of action plaintiff as the proctor of a tax lien owned and held by him and acquired by him as administrator of the estate of said intestate, Helen A. Berry, deceased, by purchase at private tax sale of said southeast quarter of section ten, township thirty, north of range ten west of the sixth principal meridian in Holt county, Nebraska, for the delinquent and unpaid tax of the year 1893, for that year amounting to \$10.86, and 1894, for that year amounting to \$9.86, which taxes were duly and respectfully levied and assessed for said years and the same being delinquent and unpaid, that for 1893, he duly advertised and said premises for sale in the month of October, 1899 for the delinquent and unpaid taxes for the year of 1893 and not being sold for want of bidders the county treasurer so reported to the county clerk of said Holt county and the tax for 1893, becoming delinquent and remaining unpaid, the county treasurer of said Holt county duly advertised the same and said premises for sale; said advertisement being made in the month of October, 1899, and the same being sold to plaintiff on the 18th day of March, 1901, bought said premises of the county treasurer of Holt county, the county treasurer having unduly reported to the county clerk that said premises had not been sold at public sale and thus acquired the lien paying the amount with interest and cost thereon for said taxes of 1893 and 1894 the sum of \$24.47. Plaintiff's petition alleges said tax sale is invalid as a tax sale for the reason that said Holt county, charged to the owners of said land twenty cents for advertising the same for sale for the unpaid tax of 1893 and twenty cents for advertising the same for the unpaid tax of 1894, but said county paid the publisher of the notice of such sale but ten cents at any rate much less than twenty cents for each of said advertisements, whereby said tax sale to plaintiff was invalid as a tax sale and said tax sale was invalid for other reasons whereby by reason of the invalidity of said tax sale plaintiff has become subrogated to the rights of Holt county in its relation to the owners of said land herein described and may proceed at once to foreclose said tax liens.

Plaintiff claims there is now due him, on said second cause of action the sum of \$41.47 and is entitled to interest at ten per cent upon that amount and also upon the sum of \$39.00, alleged to be due him on his first cause of action until said amounts so due him be satisfied and plaintiff prays for a decree that defendants be required to pay the amount of said sums so due him or that said land may be sold to satisfy the amount found due him.

You defendants are required to answer said petition on or before the 16th of May, 1901.

To make wow-wow sauce chop fine sufficient parsley to make two table-spoonfuls. Rub it on a plate with a spatula, adding a few drops of vinegar until it is like a paste, then add three pickled walnuts chopped fine, and three gherkins chopped fine; four olives, also chopped. Put a tablespoonful of butter into a saucepan; when melted add a tablespoonful of flour; mix; add half a pint of good stock. Stir until stock is

boiling. Take from the fire; add a table-spoonful of vinegar, a table-spoonful of mushroom ketchup and let it simmer for ten minutes. Strain and add the parsley and hot mixture, and turn it into the sauce tureen. It is eaten on boiled or corned beef. - March Ladies' Home Journal.
