Kaiser Digs Salisbury's Ribs.

Japanese Use English.
English is the language of the Japanese office—in its intercourse with foreign diplomats, and even in its telegraphic correspondence with its own representatives abroad. All telegrams from Tokio to the foreign agents of Japan are written and ciphered in English, and replied to in the same manner, though if the Foreign Minister has occasion to send a written dispatch, this, as a rule, is in Japanese, which may be said to be a cipher in itself.

Lemons for the Toilet.
Few women nowadays but know the value of lemons and the fruit is so cheap that the toilet table should not be without one. "Little yellow doctor," as some call it, lemon juice is whitening either for the hands, neck or face. A piece of lemon rubbed on the teeth removes discoloration, but the teeth must be brushed afterward or the acid will injure them. A piece of lemon tossed in the wash water is refreshing and likewise softens the water.

Wireless Telegraphy in Ireland.
At Rosslare, Co., Wexford, rapid progress is being made with the installation of Marconi's wireless telegraphic apparatus, which is being erected there. The installation will soon be ready for work, when it will be used for receiving and transmitting messages to and from the great American liners and other vessels passing by the Irish coast. Rosslare will soon become a notable name in Irish geography.

Bismarck's Fame at Home.
The question, "Who was Bismarck?" which was put by a German officer to his men, called forth some curious answers. Nine said that he founded the German empire, seven thought that he was an emperor, a great number pictured him as a general, one said that he was a poet, and another that he translated the Bible. The nearest answer was that he was "the Kaiser's greatest enemy."

A Mountain Explorer.
Sir W. Martin Conway, whose chief fame is due to his mountain exploring expeditions in the Himalayas and the Andes, has been appointed Slade professor of fine art at the University of Cambridge in succession to Dr. Charles Waldstein. The serious work of his life has been in the history of art. He has written a "History of Wood Engraving," a "History of Flemish Painting," and a "Life of Albrecht Durer." Sir Martin Conway married an American wife.

New King of Spain.
In less than a year Alfonso XIII will be king of Spain in fact as well as in name, for on May 17 next he will have attained his majority, which in Spain is sixteen years. The regency will come to an end and he will assume the full powers of his position. Between now and then his education for his office will be conducted on a higher plane than it has heretofore. He will no longer be treated as a child, but will attend all the meetings of the cabinet and will travel extensively through the kingdom.

Flying Fish in Tropics.
Flying fish, called by naturalists "Exocoetus," is a common sight to all voyagers in tropical and sub-tropical seas. Their usual length is from ten to twelve inches, though one eighteen inches long has recently been described. They are enabled to execute flying leaps by means of the great development of their forward or pectoral fins. During the flight the fins are kept quietly distended, without any motion. Their flight is rapid, greatly exceeding that of a ship going ten miles an hour.

Protecting Visitors from Dogs.
Where the owner of vicious dogs requests a woman to come into her yard and falls to protect her from the attack of the dogs, and she is severely bitten and injured by the dogs that she died from the effects of the injuries, the supreme court of Louisiana, in the case of Delsie vs. Dourriage (29 S. Rep., 731), holds that the owner of the dogs is responsible for the injuries and that \$2,000 damages therefore is not excessive.

Dressmakers Scarce in Manila.
According to one of the officers' wives who has returned for a home visit from Manila, there are now two hundred American women in Manila for whom there is only one dressmaker. He is a Chinese. Recently he was arrested for smuggling, whereupon the two hundred women began to intercede. If Sang were put in jail wherewithal could they be clothed? Fortunately Sang proved himself not guilty.

A Curiosity of Nature.
A pine tree and a birch tree have grown so close together in Woolwich, Me., that one trunk serves for both, sending forth pine branches on one side and birch on the other. The union seems a happy one, in spite of the fact that the two trees are as widely separated by the botanist as two well can be, and the gnarled branches of the pine embrace the birch in a most affectionate manner.

Corvera on Spanish Navy.
In speaking of the future of the Spanish navy recently, Admiral Corvera expressed fears that Spain might be broken into a number of small states. "I do not wish," he said, "that the interests of the navy should predominate at the expense of the other interests of the country, but observing as I do what is going on at the present, I am afraid that Spain may become like the Italy of the middle ages."

Gold from River Dredgings.
In the operation of dredging navigable channels at the mouth of the Moruya and Shoalhaven rivers in New South Wales it was discovered that the mud contained much gold dust. An automatic gold saver was then attached to the dumping machinery and it is estimated that enough gold will thus be obtained to defray the expenses of keeping the channels open.

Russians Emigrating to Siberia.
A Russian contemporary states that the emigration of Russian peasants to Eastern Siberia, and especially to the Ussuri territory, is going on at a feverish rate. During the first three months of the present year nearly 3,000 people left Odessa for Vladivostok. One single steamer carried 800 emigrants to the far east. Most of the emigrants are from southern Russia.

Compliment to United States.
The new \$4 bill issued by the Dominion of Canada promises to become popular, for, artistically, it is a masterpiece of the engraver's skill. On its face it bears a flattering picture of the lock on the canal at Sault Ste. Marie, an engineering work purely American. This vignette is regarded as a delicate compliment to the United States.

Senator Clark Likes Paris.
Senator Clark of Montana has decided to spend a part of each year in Paris, and has offered a large sum for the house of Count Potolki, in the Avenue de Friedland, which is one of the most beautiful in Paris, only second to the Palais Castille, occupied by ex-Queen Isabella of Spain.

Chicago University Branching Out.
Theodore Jegers, the French painter and professor in the school of decorative arts, Paris, is announced as the lecturer who will conduct the courses on art to be given during the summer by the Alliance Francaise in co-operation with the University of Chicago.

Kites Stop Partridges.
Kites have been used with great success as a means to stop partridges rising and flying from cover where it is wished to keep them for shooting—the birds will not rise when kites are flying above them, fearing, doubtless, attack.

Artesian Wells of Mexico.
In the City of Mexico there are 1,071 private artesian wells and eleven public ones. This number will soon be increased, for, at the present time, many property owners are having wells bored in their yards.

Sunny Days in Cities.
In New York city, on the average, 64 per cent of the daylight hours are sunny. In Rome the figure is 55 per cent, in Madrid 45, in Vienna 38, Berlin 39, St. Petersburg 35, London 23.

Automobile Records.
Automobile racers have a record of an average of sixteen miles an hour between New York and Boston. There are ships that can beat that by eight or nine miles an hour.

Bronze Bust of Robert Lee.
Frederick Volck's bronze bust of Robert E. Lee has been presented to Washington and Lee University by Frank T. Howard of New Orleans. Value of Shocked Nerves.
According to a legal decision in the Vienna courts, "shock to the nerves" constitutes a serious accident. A passenger on a local line claimed damages, which were awarded him, for a shock to his nerves, caused by the conductor shouting out to the passengers to jump off the car, as he feared a collision.

Full of Business at 83.
Ex-Mayor Daniel D. Whitney of Brooklyn, now in his eighty-third year, is president of an insurance company, director of a bank and proprietor of a wholesale grocery store, and attends strictly to business in each of these capacities. He has lived in the same house for nearly sixty years.

Hymns in Gaelic.
The psalmody hymns committee of the Church of Scotland having reported that the majority of the Highland Presbyteries are in favor of the publication of a Gaelic hymnal, the general assembly has empowered them to adjust and issue a collection of hymns in Gaelic.

Far From the Deadly Gases.
The churches of the borough of Manhattan, New York city have sent about 30,000 boys, girls and mothers to the country this summer. Of the various churches the Episcopal sends by far the greatest number of children. Trinity church alone sending 4,000.

President of a University.
Dr. Daniel Purinton, for the last ten years president of Denison University, Granville, O., has tendered his resignation, to take effect on August 1. Dr. Purinton has accepted the presidency of West Virginia University, Morgantown, W. Va.

Swedish Restaurant Signs.
In Sweden the traveler may learn at which railway stations meals are served by huge signs, bearing a crossed knife and fork, which are posted along the road on each side of the stopping place.

Statues in London.
The proposed new statue of Queen Victoria will raise the number of London's statues of personages to thirty-one. The city has fourteen statues of statesmen and a dozen of soldiers.
